Dear Parents and Guardians, Students, and Staff:

Boy, do we know how to start off a school year with a BANG! First an earthquake followed by a hurricane, then a flood! Looks like this will be a year to remember. What will we remember it for?

If you missed 9th Grade/New Student Orientation or Back to School Night then let me fill you in. The message was clear. From school staff, Boosters and CHS PTSA—GET INVOLVED! Students and parents alike. To get started we ask simply that you JOIN the PTSA. Your memberships make this a vital organization to our school community. Student Services is committed to keeping you updated on all the activities and events provided through our office. The Student Services staff (school counselors, registrars, school psychologist and secretary) encourage you to use our website, www.centennialeagles.org to get information about college visits, testing information, volunteer and job opportunities and evening programs offered by Student Services and other entities in the county. Be sure to check it regularly.

Classroom Guidance sessions are conducted by the school counselors for every grade level at Centennial beginning in September. Students are introduced or re-introduced to the services and resources and staff available to them through Student Services. In addition, school counselors teach various lessons throughout the year that are designed to expose students to best practices leading to a successful high school experience that will be valuable beyond graduation. In these beginning of the year lessons, seniors receive college preparation and post-high school planning information, strategies for academic and personal success are presented to juniors and sophomores, and freshman students are exposed to high school transition information. Details are available below when each activity is conducted.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR SENIORS

College Application and Transcript Request Process—Details regarding the new process will be available through the Student Services link on Centennial's website at centennialeagles.org. The green and red recommendation folders, provided for all juniors in the spring, contains the information you need to get started with the application process. (Seniors must see the counselor if the recommendation folders were not received, completed and/or submitted.) Be sure to provide at least four weeks notice for your request and **meet your deadlines!**

College Representatives Visit CHS—PARTICIPATION GUIDELINES!

Many colleges from all over the country visit Centennial and conduct short presentations for our seniors and juniors about their colleges and admission requirements. A list of colleges that are visiting CHS is always posted on the bulletin board in Student Services, Quicknotes and on our website. **Seniors and Juniors** may sign up for up to four college visits. We encourage students to choose carefully! Passes will be delivered during first period on the day of the visit. **Please note that if a teacher requests to keep the student in class for that day, that request will override the pass/permission to attend and the student will be required to stay in class.** Below are the schedule college visits.
